



# Daisy

(Remember always ask permission and clean up after you are done)



## Materials Needed:

2 empty toilet paper tubes  
Paint or colored paper  
Rubber band  
Cardboard  
Tissue paper or a colored circle for the middle  
Glue  
Scissors

## Directions:



To make one flower, paint or cover with paper the inside and outside of two empty toilet paper tubes.



Put a rubber band around a tube about 2 inches up from the tube. This will serve as a marker when you cut the petals. Before you cut mark off fairly equal segments. I cut nine petals on each tube. I made small hash marks at the top so I knew where to cut. They don't have to be perfect but you don't want to end up with one super skinny petal. Cut your petals and repeat with the second tube.



Bend the petals outward. Cut one of the tubes all the way through to open it. Now close the opening and make it small enough to fit snugly in the other tube and re-glue this tube.



Glue the smaller tube into the middle of the larger tube. Off-set the petals this will make the flower look fuller.



Glue the back of the daisy to a piece of cardboard (if you are painting) or green cardstock. When it's dry, cut away any excess cardboard/paper.



Take a long piece of cardboard and either cover paint it green or cover it with green paper. Glue it to the back of the daisy.



Scrunch of some tissue paper and glue it into the middle of the flower to finish off the pretty daisy.
